Course Description:

This will be a non-weighted, non-honors performance based course open to all students who have passed Basic Composition and Rhetoric. Course requirements will be met through reading non-fiction literature, as well as writing non-fiction literature and various essays, and complete tests and quizzes.

Expectations:

During this class students will be expected to bring with them a notebook, the novel or piece of literature currently being studied, and a pen. Students are also expected to participate in daily reading and activities within the classroom.

There will be daily homework, including the weekends. There will be quizzes. Tests will follow the completion of each unit. There will also be at least four semester papers. The final exam will be cumulative.
